The "end of art" refers to the beginning of our modern era of art in which art no longer adheres to the constraints of imitation theory but serves a new purpose. Art began with an "era of imitation, followed by an era of ideology, followed by our post-historical era in which, with qualification, anything goes..."

Arthur Danto's argument, in After the End of Art, is that the age of the master narrative, as it applies to the practice of art, is over, and that, in effect, "anything goes" (xiv, 47).

Originally delivered as the prestigious Mellon Lectures on the Fine Arts in 1995, *After the End of Art* remains a classic of art criticism and philosophy, and continues to generate heated debate for contending that art ended in the 1960s.

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The philosopher and art critic Arthur Danto, in his essay 'The End of Art' (published in a collection of essays entitled *The Death of Art* in 1984), and further developed in his 1997 book *After the End of Art: Contemporary Art and the Pale of History* [see BIBLIOGRAPHY], applied Hegel's thesis to Modern art, arguing that indeed the traditional linear history of art since the Renaissance has come to an end, replaced by a pluralism in which everything can or has the potential to be art .
