For example, career development replaced vocational development as a rubric. Viewed objectively, career is the series of positions that an individual occupies from school through retirement. Viewed subjectively, career is the imposition of meaning on vocational behavior.

The high-order developmental construct of career adaptability (CA), which reflects a series of psychological aspects such as personality, motivation, readiness, strengths, behaviour, and attitudes, was designed in order to assess a person's readiness for successful mastery of career tasks and capacity to prepare and participate in work roles (Hartung, Porfeli, & Vondracek, 2008).
