This year marks the 50th anniversary of the reclamation of Chicano Park, a historic landmark located in the largely Mexican community of Barrio Logan, San Diego, California. Chicana/o was widely reclaimed in the 1960s and 1970s to express political empowerment, ethnic solidarity, and pride in being of Indigenous descent, diverging from the more assimilationist Mexican American identity.
