Pragmatics and Communicative Competences

Assessment of Pragmatic Aspects of Communication. A complete assessment of communication competence includes assessing a student's ability to communicate a variety of communicative intentions in a variety of situations. We are using the term pragmatic assessment here to include assessment of functional communication and assessment specifically focused on obtaining a student's perception of his/her communication competence.
