To indicate short quotations (four typed lines or fewer of prose or three lines of verse) in your text, enclose the quotation within double quotation marks. Provide the author and specific page number (in the case of verse, provide line numbers) in the in-text citation, and include a complete reference on the Works Cited page.

Use in-text citations for quotes. Place parentheses with the proper citation inside after directly after quoted material. APA style uses the author-date message. This means that if you write the name of an author you are quoting, you must follow that name with the year of publication in parentheses.

Using Block Quotes When quoting dialogue from a novel, set the quotation off from your text as a block if each character's speech starts on a new line in the source. Indent the extract half an inch from the left margin, as you would any block quotation.

E-books and online books. When citing a book you accessed online (for example through a database) or in the form of an e-book, simply add relevant information about its format or location to the end of your citation. For an online book, add the URL or DOI where it can be accessed.

To correctly quote a source, you must ensure: The quoted text is surrounded by quotation marks. The original author is correctly cited. The text is identical to the original (or you have clearly marked any changes you made).

Paraphrase - Take the information from a specific sentence, paragraph, or section of the chapter and rewrite it in your own words. Summarize - Take a larger view of the section or the chapter and rewrite it in your own words. Quote - Use the exact words written by the author and enclose the words in quotation marks.

When a source has no known author, use a shortened title of the work instead of an author name. Place the title in quotation marks if it's a short work (such as an article) or italicize it if it's a longer work (e.g. plays, books, television shows, entire Web sites) and provide a page number if it is available.

An exact quote should be in quotation marks (" "), or if the quotation is 40 words or more, should be formatted as a block quotation. Then you put an In-Text Citation right after the quotation to show where the quote came from. It is short, goes in parenthesis, includes the page number, and points to the full citation on your reference page.

Quoting has several rules that need to be followed: You should place the quotation marks at both ends on your dialogue that you are referring to. It is the quotation marks that differentiate the quote from other sentences in your essay. Use single quotation marks inside the double quotes.

Works Quoted in Another Source Sometimes an author of a book, article or website will mention another person's work by using a quotation or paraphrased idea from that source.
