The prevalence of Internet addiction in American college students is 12% and the Internet addiction rate of Iranian medical students is 10.8% [3, 4]. Worse yet, studies have shown that the rate of Internet addiction in Serbian schoolchildren is 18.7% [5].

Results: The majority of respondents were classified as normal users of the Internet ($n = 2386$, 94.19%), with 127 (5.01%) moderately addicted and 20 (0.79%) seriously addicted.
