Enterocutaneous Fistula - Pictures, What is, Pathophysiology
Infected pancreatic necrosis has an extremely high incidence of 50%. Trauma patients have a 2% to 25% incidence, and abdominal sepsis has a 20% to 25% incidence 3). Enterocutaneous fistulas are best managed by a multidisciplinary team that includes a stoma or wound care nurse, dietitian, and therapist.

Strictly speaking, an enterocutaneous fistula connects the small bowel to the skin. 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The desired endpoint of the medical management of a fistula is spontaneous closure. Approximately 19% to 40% of all fistulas will close spontaneously with conservative medical management, but only when sepsis is controlled and nutrition support is adequate and appropriate (Kassis and Makary, 2008).

Management of draining wounds and fistulas ...
Spontaneous closure of an ECF is defined as closing with medical management within 6 to 8 weeks (Teixeira et al., 2009). Wong et al. (2004) report 90% of simple type 1 fistulas close spontaneously, whereas <10% of complex type 2 fistulas close spontaneously.

The management of intestinal fistulas should follow surgical principles in terms of patient resuscitation and sepsis control. Eventually, the treatment also needs to take into account the associated mesh infection.
