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If providing CPR for an infant the ratio of compressions to breaths remains the same but the method of performing

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compressions changes. For an infant you should use 2-3 fingers in the center of the chest on the lower half of the breast bone to compress the chest about 1 ½”.

It may be reasonable for the provider to

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deliver 1 breath every 6 seconds (10 breaths per minute) while continuous chest compressions are being performed (ie, during CPR with an advanced airway). For children in shock, an initial fluid bolus of 20 mL/kg is reasonable.

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Immediately following the shock, begin CPR for 5 cycles (or approximately 2 minutes). Begin CPR for 2 minutes (5 cycles).
