ACI Committee 201, durability of Portland cement concrete is defined as its ability to resist weathering action, chemical attack, abrasion, or any other process of deterioration; that is, durable concrete will retain its original form, quality, and serviceability when exposed to its environment.

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Durability of concrete is determined by its ability to resist

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weathering action, chemical attack, abrasion, or any other process of deterioration, and will retain its original form, quality, and serviceability when exposed to its environment. Durable concrete is a result of proper design, proportioning, placement, finishing, testing, inspection, and curing.

All concrete in service will be subject to chemical and physical changes.

SERVICEABILITY AND DURABILITY OF CONCRETE . 1. How can we prevent the effect of freezing and thawing in concrete? Concrete can be restricted from frost action, damage of the structure by the entrainment of air. This entrainment of air is distributed through the cement paste with spacing between bubbles of no more than about 0.4mm. 2.

Workability is one of the physical parameters of concrete which affects the strength and durability as well as the cost of labor and appearance of the finished product. Concrete is said to be workable when it is easily placed and compacted homogeneously i.e without bleeding or Segregation.

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CHAPTER 1 COMPONENTS OF CONCRETE Concrete is made up of two components, aggregates and paste. Aggregates are generally classified into two groups, fine and coarse, and occupy about 60 to 80 percent of the volume of concrete. The paste is composed of cement, water, and entrained air and ordinarily constitutes 20 to 40 percent of the total volume.

## **CHAPTER 1 COMPONENTS OF CONCRETE**

Strength of concrete prepared with cement stored for longer periods gets affected adversely. With 3 month long stored cement, there is a 20% reduction in strength of concrete, whereas when cement is stored for two years, the 28 day

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concrete strength reduces by 50%.
