A 2nd grader and a 7th grader with the same RIT score are both answering items of the same level

of difficulty. However, when testing, the item content seen by the 2nd grader will be different from the item content seen by the 7th grader because the content that is included in the MAP Growth K-2 test is different from the math content included ...

For example, the mean growth norm(Reading) for a third grade student is 10.3 “points” from the beginning of the year(Fall) to the end of the year. Since the average third grade student earns a score of 188.3 on the NWEA MAP Reading in the fall, the anticipated, or target, score to earn for Spring is 198.6.

Understanding NWEA MAP(RIT) Scores - Resources by HEROES

Equal-interval means that a change of 10 RIT points indicates the same thing regardless of whether a student is at the top, bottom, or middle of the scale. A RIT score has the same meaning regardless of grade level or age of the student. You can compare scores over time to tell how much growth a student has made.

NWEA assessments: Resources for Parents

The average RIT score associated with a particular grade/subject tends to be lower in 2020 than in 2015. This means that the same RIT score for the same grade level, for the same testing season, and in the same subject area will generally be associated with a higher status percentile rank in the 2020 norms than in the 2015 norms.

For example, since few students in the fall of pre-K have the skills to achieve Level 1 competency, any score of Level 1 or better is scored as Exceeds Expectations. However, by winter of second grade, students are expected to have mastered these skills and moved on to oral reading, so all levels are scored as Below Expectations.

These studies are used to identify MAP Growth scores that predict likely performance on state summative tests. These scores vary by subject, grade and test season, and are different within each state, since each state sets its proficiency standards individually or uses a consortia assessment such as PARCC or SBAC.

The Meets Grade Levelcut score demarks the minimum level of performance considered to be proficient for accountability purposes. MAP Growth interim assessments from NWEA are computer adaptive and aligned to state- specific content standards. Scores are reported on the RIT vertical scale with a range of 100- 350.

A Grade 3 student with a MAP Growth Reading RIT score of 192 in the fall is likely to meet proficiency on the Georgia Milestones ELA test in the spring, whereas a Grade 3 student with a MAP Growth Reading RIT score lower than 192 in the fall is in jeopardy of not meeting proficiency.
