As helpful as the Frayer Model is, this, too, can turn into a rote, ineffective practice if a teacher overuses it or neglects the best practices for direct vocabulary instruction. 3. Indirect vocabulary instruction is key. Students can learn vocabulary from hearing and seeing words repeatedly in different contexts.

4 Strategies for Teaching Vocabulary to your Students ...

Vocabulary is an important aspect in reading comprehension. If students do not know what the words mean, they cannot understand what they are reading. Research has shown that vocabulary deficiencies are a primary cause of academic failure in grades 3 through 12. (Baumann, Kameenui, Stanovich, & Becker) Unfortunately, too many of our students have poor oral language skills.
